Steve showed us his insect collection, mostly captured outside of this area and suggested that it would be helpful and educational for many local people if such a collection were made containing our indigenous species.

Steve made known his interest in developing a working relationship with the RIA, starting with this new co-operative collecting effort. We are fortunate to have someone like Steve as an extension agent in our county. He is both knowledgeable and open-minded, and dedicated to making information available to local people.

The "Roques' Gallery" is part of that information effort. The collection would be designed to be portable, could be set up at libraries, used by various groups for educational purposes, etc. People are needed to help specimens. Having a focused place and purpose for collection and identification should be a great stimulus to carry through with becoming familiar with the myriad species around us.
