The morning after arriving in Nairobi the group packed off to Lake Naivasha for three days of orientation and to climb Mt. Longonot. At orientation we met our professors and got a better idea of what the next four months of the semester would entail. The following is an outline of those months with in-depth descriptions to be provided in upcoming editions of the Hill News.
